CEC Fund Report

- Andy Corn Budget Briefing
- Mandatory fees: Pro-rata per credit: \$1/credit
- Annual CEC Budget components
 Operating Budget and Project Funding Budget set by the committee in Nov. 7th Hearing.
 - Purchasing of REC's with PSE Approximately \$60K/yr at present. Primary purpose of the fund.
 - Admin Allowance Payment for committee members (learning allotments).
 - Operating Budget For committee supplies and WOHESC travel in March.
 - <u>Project Funding Budget</u> How much funding we're willing to set aside for projects this year. 2022-23 allowance was set in Nov. 7th hearing.
- Current Balance:
 - \$467K total capital at present
 - Projected \$83K in Fee Revenue this year
- o Idea: Funding a larger project through a bond that the CEC repays over time, binding future committees to repayment of the bond.
- Scott: Mentions that Grant Program Matches can be used to fund such projects as the Solar Grant (OlySol?), Energy Efficiency Project, Seminar I complex demonstration project, and Heat pumps, but there is more to be explored here.
- Capital / Legislative Budget Insights from William Ward

Hearing Process

- Quorum is required to conduct board action: Minimum of 2 voting staff and 2 voting student members.
 - 5 students present, 4 voting student members
 - 2 Voting staff present, Scott serving as proxy for William Ward
 - Quorum achieved
- o Structure of hearing a project proposal
 - 5-10 minutes for proposing student or staff to give a presentation on the project.
 - 5 minutes for the committee to question the presenter
 - 5 minutes for committee deliberation without presenter input
 - Chair requests motion, then a voting member must put forth a motion and be seconded for chair to call a vote.
- o Motions are said and recorded in full when possible
- o Secretary (Josh) records motion, second, and vote.
- 2 staff & 2 student votes required for motion pass

• Mock proposal: Solar Tacoma: Michael (of CEC lore)

Presentation

- Evergreen Satellite Tacoma campus didn't own the building. Now we own the building!
- Engineer structural suitability -> milestone follow-up larger project in progress
 - Eventual demonstration site for solar display.
 - \$7500 requested (see proposal)
 - Future group needs to look at maintenance

Q&A/Discussion

- Question: do they stay or do they go? Up to group.
- Teddy: Concerns of damage to solar panels, and how to maintain.
- Cleo: no concerns
- Keira: comments made but unrecorded due to technical difficulties
- Olivia: future committee would be expected to invest \$90,000 to accomplish project end goal! The \$7500 feasibility study might go to waste without external funding.

o Motion

- Teddy motions to grant \$7500 to solarize tacoma project, with stipulation that they return with progress updates and full evaluation of feasibility and future costs analysis. Cleo seconds.
- Scott makes a comment: that there will be clarity after the engineering report
- The motion passes with 5 yes 1 no

Application: Reducing Food Miles

Presentation

- Reducing food miles, actual grant proposal, Beth, Farm Manager
- Overview of project and history of student discounts at Farm.
- Subsidizes price of vegetables/food to give discount to students to cover expenses.
- Evergreen Organic Farm CEC partnership program is a pioneer project that provides a

lot of value to the community.

- Teddy: Need more \$? Growth would be great.
- Keira: Data? Data collection has only improved recently.
- Olivia: Looking ahead 3 years? \$30K
- Josh: No question or concerns: I am impressed with the EBT access and the student discount. Incredible program. Very happy to continue funding and look forward to future growth of the program. This subsidy is fantastic.
- Beth: online ordering coming soon! Clover system
- Scott: Timing of grant when farm stand closes?
- Beth: Due to Seasonal farming budgeting
- Olivia: Miles from shipping? Pick-up only
- Josh: CSAs? Yes, changing though.
- Beth: Primer on CSAs: Community Supported Agriculture / Subscription Seasonally for Upfront funding. Very good for farmers.
- Olivia: Why so much for 3 years? Thinking big!
- Keira: Growing interest? Advertisement? Yes. Don't know how to quantify.
- Beth Exits, Thank you's.

Concerns & Discussion:

- Potentially a lot of our available funds. Can we recover funds from elsewhere to compensate? Such as changing REC policy?
- Desire for CEC branding logo for funding the discount. Placement next to the \$5 sign at the point-of-the-sale. nothing else much needed. We can ask to see data from their point of sale system.
- Rather than funding for three years at once, perhaps funding one year at a time.
- \$10K per year, not \$30k from one year
- Their system is reimbursement-based for a line of credit that they may not use it.
 Their system reinforces
- Annual reporting needed
- Stipulation vs. Request?
- Data reporting discussion: food security vs/ production in winter

Motion

- Kayla motions to fund the Organic Farm \$20,000 for FY23 and FY24 with the stipulation that the Farm add "sponsored by CEC" or CEC logo to announcements, and a request for annual discount usage data and more information about plans for winter fresh foods access for students.
- Keira: seconded.
- Olivia: seen
- Vote: 6 yes, 4 student 2 staff
