

Marine Bioresources Internship

Special enrollment students will need a waiver in order to register for more than 8 credits if enrolled concurrently with Marine Fisheries and Human Health.

Description:

This internship offering is a requirement for completion of the Marine Bioresources Certificate. Students need to complete 16 credits total of internship, and they may distribute that over one or two quarters as necessary. The internship is offered for 8 credits in Spring quarters and for up to 16 credits in summer. Waivers for internships happening in Fall and Winter are available, and faculty are available to sponsor those internships.

Students must seek out their own internship opportunities—internships in summer tend to be highly competitive, so students should apply to a diversity of opportunities and complete applications early. Internship listings are available through the Evergreen Internship liaison, Luis Apolaya Torres (Luis.Apolaya_Torres@evergreen.edu) and also distributed campus-wide through the regular Inside Evergreen emails (with the subject “New Internship Opportunities”).

Students already working in a job relevant to Marine Bioresources (as broadly defined) can apply their current work to the internship requirement. Please inquire with Pauline if you have questions about this.

Students are expected to adhere to college policies regarding internship applications and contract completion. Note that the deadline for contract completion is later than for independent internship contracts, however, the contract must be completed because the supervisor (and internship site provider) must also be in alignment with college policies.
