
We administered a survey of Evergreen students about the New Directions model from May 18th to May 26th. 143 students responded. Respondents were directed to a separate website to review a version of the New Directions proposal, then asked a series of questions about their reactions to the draft model. (Note that this was an early iteration of the model that omitted the proposed "Schools" structure). The survey is in the appendix.

What is your first reaction to the model?	Count	Percent

87/142 respondents (61.2%) reacted positively, while 124/142 (87.3%) reacted either neutrally or positively.

Below is a list of features of the proposed model of the college. How important is each feature to you?

Students prefer the basis and ideals that Evergreen is known for being improved upon and for their degrees to be "worth" more in the eyes of those outside more than labels. These scores are on a scale of 3 to -1, with 3 being "Very Important" and -1 being "Not at all Important", with all other options falling in the middle.

4. Here are some areas of the curriculum we may add or expand as part of this initiative. Which of the following areas would you be interested in studying?



Since these areas of study are also on a scale of 3 to -1, it seems that students had a much less positive reaction to the idea of new areas of study. This could be attributed to the fact that current students would likely not be here if they did not have interest in any of the current areas of study, so new areas are less likely to appeal to current students than to new students. With the openended portion of the question, the most common trend mentioned was some type of natural science.

Based on the description of the new model, how would it change your plans to enroll at the college in the future, assuming tuition is about the same as at present?

131/143 people were either more likely (n=64) or unaffected (n=67) on enrolling to the college if the new model was implemented.


1. Based on the description of the new model, how would it change your plans to enroll at the college in the future, assuming tuition does not significantly change?

124/143 students thought the model was unique (n=55) or somewhat unique (n=69).

97/143 (67.8%) students were likely or very likely to recommend the college based on the new model.
