

The Environmental Resource Liaison's acts as the representative of the GSU in discussions of Land, Ecological, and Natural Resource management on campus. They advocate for student safety and environmental sustainability in matters of facility use, upgrades, expenditures, and disposal. This person will develop an extensive understanding of campus environmental policy and procedure. Additionally, in partnership with the campus administration, they will monitor and verify the proper execution of student health and safety reviews of water; waste; and energy use and access.

- a. Serve on the Clean Energy Committee
- b. Work with Parking Services to ensure student consideration
- c. Sit as the student representative in Space and Land Usage Group
- d. Serve as a liaison between the school's other land usage related committees and the GSU
- e. With a focus on student effects-- identify city, county, and state policies regarding land and resources; energy usage; environmental impact on ecology
- f. Along with student life officer(s),
 1. Provide the GSU a regular campus safety report
 2. Ensure that administration is properly and regularly performing health and safety checks of student spaces
 3. Develop a strong working relationship with Residential and Dining Services
- g. Develop a strong relationship with the Organic Farm
- h. Promote sustainability, clean energy, and environmentally friendly practices on campus
- i. Other duties as assigned

Rationale: Goals may not align with spirit of the position

1. Center for Community-Based Learning and Action

The primary goal of CCBLA is to build connections between community-based learning models and academic programs; chronicle the history of community-based learning and action at Evergreen; support civic engagement; and promote a better understanding of social justice issues for all. *May be more suited to Student Life, Internal, or External*
2. Police Services
 - a. The primary goal of Police Services is to keep the campus community safe through law enforcement. The governing authorities and responsibilities of Police Services are found in Federal, State, and city/county laws—including Revised Code of Washington (RCW) and Washington Administrative Code (WAC). Additionally, Police Services is involved in matters of Student Rights and Title IX. *May be more suited to Chief Justice or Historian/Policy Analyst*
3. Basic Needs Center
 - a. The BNC offers basic needs essentials and emergency funding. These services fall inline with student services. *May be more suited to Student Life or Internal.*
