Examples of acceptable forms of documentation of Native heritage include: Certificate of Indian Blood (CIB), photocopy of both sides of a federally recognized tribal enrollment card, (copy of birth certificate for Native Hawaiians only), letter from an federally recognized Alaska Native village/tribe identifying the applicant as a citizen, or a letter from a federally recognized tribal enrollment office identifying the applicant as a descendant. If you have questions about this, contact us.**

Please note that if awarded a grant, you will be asked to sign an agreement that will allow the Longhouse to use the video created with Longhouse funds for educational and promotional purposes. You will retain the copyright to the creative content within the video
