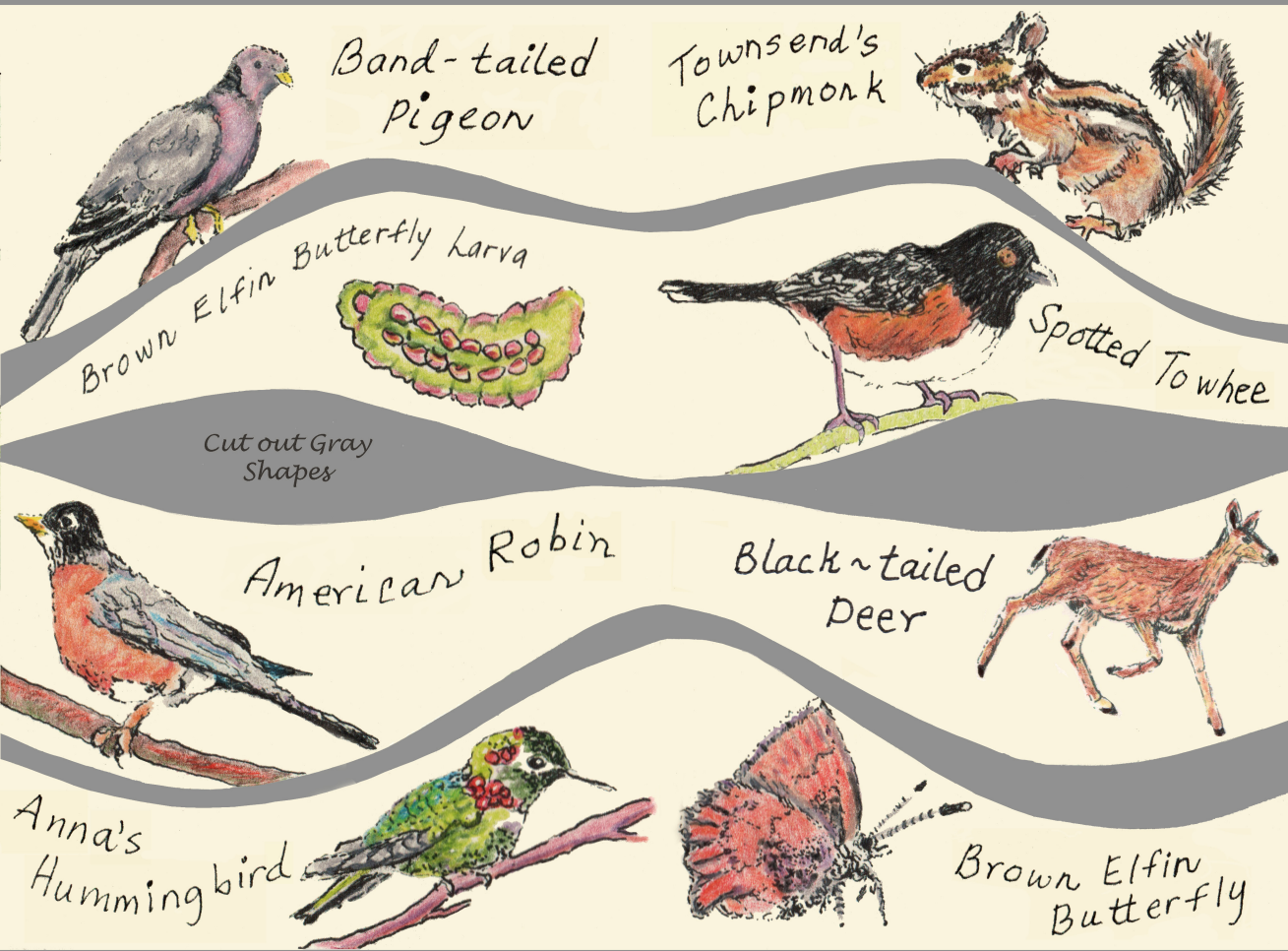


1. Trim 1/8 inch along short edges of paper. 2. Fold paper in half, hamburger-style, with this side on the outside and the title page on the inside. 3. Fold each side toward the fold to make an accordion fold book. 4. Open book and cut out gray shapes

5. Refold the booklet, making sure the title page is on top.

↑ Salal Leaves in Fall

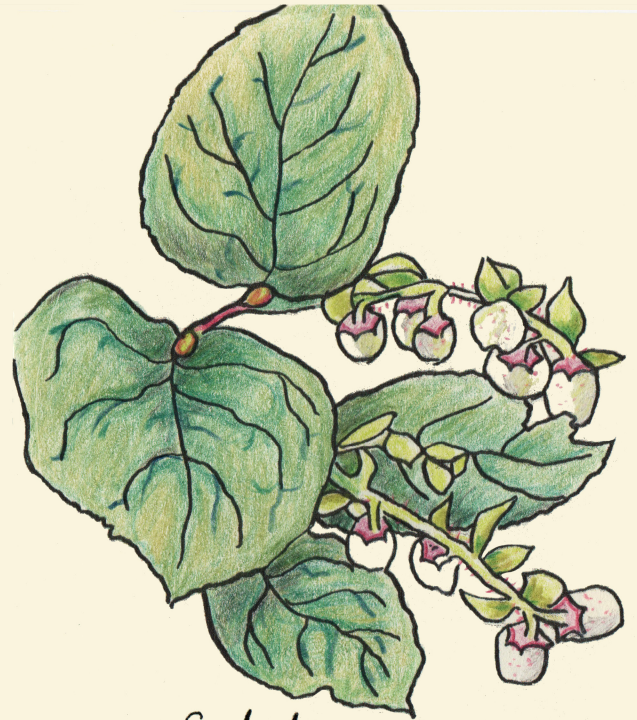


Salal: Evergreen shrub that grows 2-5' tall and 3-8' wide. It prefers partial to full shade and moist to dry soil.

Salal blooms in late spring providing nectar to hummingbirds and bees. Its berries turn dark blue midsummer to feed birds and mammals.

Its leaves host butterfly larvae and provide year-long shelter for birds and small mammals.
