Andy, a research ecologist, has worked, on and off, for the British Columbia government since 1982, in research for the BC Forest Service. He's also an adjunct professor in Resource and Environmental Management at Simon Fraser University and teaches field courses for the University of Victoria and University of British Columbia in Bamfield and Haida Gwaii.
